SCAN TO DONATE

One of ARO's strongest assets is our veterinary team led by Dr Reuben Kotze. Hundreds, if not thousands of animals are treated, cured and saved from a life of cruelty by the skilled staff that make up the veterinary team. Every day our Animal Welfare Assistants (AWAs) go out in mobile clinics to different locations, helping communities with primary animal healthcare. Most days our onsite clinic has a queue of pet owners waiting to see our AWAs for medical treatment, while our veterinarians and nurses are in theatre performing life-changing surgeries such as sterilisation. To this day, sterilisation remains the most effective way to control the birth of and cruelty towards unwanted animals. ARO remains committed in our mission to relieve, care and educate.



Our team is determined to save more animals – a mission that is only made possible through our partnership with Oscars Arc Woof Project. The surrendered and rescued dogs that come in through our onsite clinic and mobile clinics are treated, assessed and then sent to Oscars Arc to be rehomed. Kitten adoptions are still being managed by ARO. ARO understands the struggle that communities face, and the fact that not many people are in the position to pay for costly surgeries to improve the lives of their animals.

Dr Kotze is one of the country's top oporthopaedic surgeons with numerous referrals from other animal

welfares and private vets. He performs life-changing surgeries on countless animals every month, improving their health and their quality of life. As many pet owners know, the costs of performing these types of surgeries are in excess of R10 000. Dr Kotze is determined and passionate about helping animals with their orthopaedic needs and makes a plan to help them even if only for a small donation. This is only possible because of the help we receive every day from our supporters and donors. Thank you!

The passion in my belly is almost tangible! Especially when I am surrounded by like-minded people not only in my team but within other organisations. There is one common goal amongst us all and that is to help – be it animal welfare, animal rescue or youth education, we all just want to help. And by helping animals, we are helping communities not only with veterinary care for their pets, but also by imparting the tools and knowledge needed to take better care of themselves and their beloved animals.

There isn't a week that goes by that I'm not shocked to the core at the sight of some of the animals brought in; I cannot fathom how someone can ignore such pain and suffering. Yet at the same time, I'm blown away at how treasured some of the animals are by their owners – from sporting the cutest little outfits to being transported in their chariots (makeshift push-carts, prams and trolleys). We see both extremes at ARO and no two days are the same.

From a young age, we are taught that we can only control what we can control. Which means that we have the ability and control to do more. It's not always about donating money, it could be a conversation with someone on the importance of feeding your dog every day, ensuring they have access to fresh water or even debating the importance of sterilisation. I often wonder if people would adjust their mindsets if they were to take a tour through animal welfare kennels for a true reflection of breeding...

Be that as it may, we will continue to work hard on impact-driven strategies within communities in the next few months, focusing on relieving, caring, educating and ultimately reaching more animals that need our help.











What a busy start to 2021

We were deeply saddened by the untimely passing away of Mrs Sharon Adams of our administration department, who served on our team for 26 years.

Our team has also gained three new staff members – Dr Natasha Clark joined us in December 2020, Megan Beukes joined us in January 2021 as the new Clinic Receptionist, and Ashley Hartney joined us as Admin Receptionist.

It is with a heavy heart that we report of the traumatic armed robbery that took place at our clinic on 22 January 2021; thankfully none of our staff were physically harmed. To ensure their mental well-being however, all our staff were given trauma counselling by Karen Day to help them in processing the ordeal. Teagan Schwerin, our Head of Fundraising & Communications, put out an appeal in our monthly e-newsletter for donations towards replacing the stolen items and upgrading our security, which received very favourable support.

The first phase of our security upgrade was to replace the existing electric fencing around the perimeters of our building and to connect it to our alarm system. This was finalised on 5 March 2021. The second phase will be to install additional fencing and security gates on our outside porch to limit the numbers congregating there, and to better control entry into the clinic and administrative buildings. We are currently in the planning stage of this project, and hope to have it implemented during the second quarter of 2021.

Our fundraising team have confirmed that we will be hosting our annual Golf Day on Friday, 7 May 2021.


ARO is dependent upon the generosity of our donors to run efficiently. We have been very fortunate this year that our loyal donors have not let us down in our time of need.

HOSPITAL & FIELDWORK REPORT

Our hospital staff successfully completed the City Of Cape Town Mass Animal Sterilisation Project and we reached our target of 250 spays. In addition to the 250 we sterilised on this campaign, an additional 124 animals were sterilised this quarter. We also treated 1 857 animals this quarter for various other conditions.

CoGH SPCA reported that a total of 11 842 animals were sterilised in the City of Cape Town MASP with 62% being females and 38% being males.





MOBILE CLINICS

We currently have two mobiles clinics in operation. After completing the CoCT Sterilisation Campaign, it was evident that we've yet to see the tip of the iceberg, and so our teams are working hard in our traditional areas of Delft, Nyanga, Philipi, KTC and Gugulethu to bring animals in to be spayed and neutered.





ARO VETS IN ACTION


Simba came in to have a rugby sized tumor removed.
